This poster can be used to track candidate progress while preparing for and participating in a work-at-height evaluation.

Numbers in the table correspond to requirements in SPRAT's *Work-at-Height Certification Requirements* and *Work-at-Height Evaluation Guidelines*.

Candidate Rights and Responsibilities

1. A SPRAT certification belongs to the certified individual.
2. Candidates have the right to provide feedback on any public SPRAT documentation.
3. Candidates have the responsibility to follow the Evaluation Session Host site's access work plan.
4. Candidates have the responsibility to act professionally towards the Evaluator, the Evaluation Session Host, and fellow candidates.
5. Candidates have the responsibility to adhere to SPRAT's performance principles.
6. Candidates have the right to not be asked to do anything that would violate SPRAT's performance principles.
7. Candidates have the right to ask questions to clarify an Evaluator's instructions.
8. Candidates have the right to an explanation behind an Evaluator's issuance of a discrepancy or fail.
9. Candidates have the right and responsibility to appeal or register a complaint regarding the evaluation session.
